**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

**ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **University of Missouri Health Care (UM) System** assume the proposal would have a potential negative impact on the University in excess of \$100,000 the first year. Subsequent years would be less than \$100,000. The potential impact is due to additional staffing (\$75,000 estimate) that must take place to fulfill the requirements of the proposal and corresponding remodeling that will also be required.

**Oversight** assumes the UM System currently has in place dietary staff and policies and procedures that already meet many of the requirements of the proposal and that any provisions that are not currently met, will not require a significant investment. Oversight assumes the UM System can implement the provisions of this proposal with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Mental Health** and the **Department of Social Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials at the **Bates County Memorial Hospital** responded to Oversight's request but did not indicate a fiscal impact.

Officials from the following **hospitals**: Barton County Memorial Hospital, Cedar County Memorial Hospital, Cooper County Hospital, Excelsior Springs Medical Center, Putnam County Memorial Hospital and Washington County Memorial Hospital did not respond to **Oversight's** request for a statement of fiscal impact.
