FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight notes this proposal requires high school students to receive thirty minutes of instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation in order to graduate. This proposal starts with the 2017-2018 (FY 2018) school year. Currently school districts have the option of providing this instruction. Oversight can not determine how many schools may currently teach this class.

Oversight assumes school districts per this proposal, would include this instruction in their required health or physical education courses. Oversight assumes that since it is only thirty minutes of instruction it can be added to the existing health and physical education classes. Therefore, Oversight will not show an impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal. School districts may be impacted by the proposal. DESE defers to the school districts for impact.

Officials at the **Bakersfield** and the **Crocker** school districts each assume a cost of \$5,000 annually.

Officials at the **Bloomfield School District** assume an unknown impact for the instructor and materials.

Officials at the **Brentwood School District** assume \$192 for curriculum development and assessment.

Officials at the **Concordia School District** assume a cost of \$150 per person to be trained and certified each year.

Officials at the **East Newton School District** assume \$100 per day to pay for instructor x 10 days = \$1,000. Plus \$2,000 to purchase CPR dummies.

Officials at the **Eldon School District** assume a cost of \$3,200.

Officials at the **Everton School District** assume a cost of \$1,000.

Officials at the **New Haven School District** assume \$20 per student receiving training for materials and models. Fifty students per class brings a cost to \$1,000 annually.

Officials at the **Hawthorne Leadership School** assume \$2,500.

Officials at the **Kearney School District** assume \$2,000 annually.

Officials at the **Kansas City Public Schools** assume a limited, if any, negative impact.

Officials at the **Cassville School District** assume an impact of \$11,500.

Officials at the **Kennett School District** assume an impact that is unknown at this time.

Officials at the **Smithville School District** assume \$20,000 to train current health teacher and provide necessary curriculum.

Officials at the **St. Charles School District** assume a cost of \$36,000.

Officials at the **St. Elizabeth School District** assume they already do this and it costs about \$200 for training.

Officials at the **Wright City R-II School District** assume a cost of \$25,000.

Officials at the **Tipton School District** assume they already do this.

Officials at the **Chilhowee R-IV, Fredericktown, Macon County R-IV, Malta Bend, Middle Grove C-1, Riverview Gardens, Sarcoxie R-II, Shell Knob, Warren County R-III** and the **West Plains** school districts each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective districts.

Officials at the **Avilla R-XIII, Carondelet Leadership Academy, Kingston 42** and the **Kirbyville** school districts each assume they would not be fiscally impacted as they are K-8 districts only.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.


