FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** stated this legislation would not be expected to significantly impact the operations of the DOH. If the proposal were to substantially impact the DOH programs, then the Department would request funding through the legislative process.

The proposed legislation would reduce the number of inspections of temporary food stands that would be required of public health agencies, or potentially district DOH staff. A very small cost savings could result because of fewer required inspections, but currently DOH inspects very few food sales by religious, charitable or non-profit organizations.

Officials from the **Moniteau County Health Department** stated they might save the initial environmental inspection time, but they believe the time would be lost by having to follow-up on food borne illnesses. Overall cost savings would be \$0 to minimal.

Officials from the **Pettis County Health Department, St. Louis County Health Department, Greene County Health Department, and Cole County Health Department** did not respond to our request for a fiscal impact statement.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This bill exempts all food sales by religious, charitable, and nonprofit organizations at religious and charitable functions from all state laws and regulations relating to food inspection.

DESCRIPTION (continued)

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
