FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would change the law governing the relocation of a child by a custodial parent. The Office of State Courts Administrator would develop and adopt a uniform form for providing notice to a nonrelocating party of a proposed relocation due to exigent circumstances. The proposal sets out information to be contained in the form and provides procedures for the nonrelocating party to oppose relocation requests.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. This legislation would not affect Total State Revenue.
