FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section-162.015 Recall of Board of Directors:

Officials of the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume no fiscal impact to their department, however, officials assume there could be fiscal impact to the Kansas City School District if a recall election were held. Officials did not estimate election costs.

Officials of the **Kansas City School District** assume that if a recall election were held, based on costs of regular board elections, cost to the district could be approximately \$93,000.

Officials of the **Kansas City Board of Election Commission** stated that the Kansas City School District constitutes about 60% of the election boards district, therefore, cost of an at-large recall election would be a little under or over \$100,000.

Oversight assumes this proposal provides for procedures to recall school board members in the Kansas City School District. The proposal does not mandate that school board members be recalled, therefore, for the purposes of this fiscal note, Oversight will show fiscal impact as either \$0 or (Unknown) and would expect costs of an election to not exceed \$100,000. Oversight assumes no state fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes the provisions of House Amendments 1, 2, and 3 would have no fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill creates recall procedures for Kansas City school board members, (provided the member has served on the board for more than ninety days), in addition to the procedure available under the academic deficiency statute (Section 160.538). Recall petitions can originate from the voters of a subdistrict for a member who represents that subdistrict or from the district at large for an at-large member. The required number of signatures for the petition is 25% of the voters who voted in the last election. The bill specifies the requirements for filing the petition, its physical form and content, and the procedure for verifying signatures. If a majority votes to retain the recalled member, the member remains in office and cannot be subject to another recall, except as provided in the academically deficient school statute. If the member is recalled, a successor would be chosen at the next scheduled date available for school elections.

The substitute also requires persons running for election to seven-member school district boards to have lived and been registered to vote in the district for a year. The current prohibition against City of St. Louis school board members being related to school district employees within the second degree is repealed, as are the provisions specifying election by and composition of subdistricts.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
