FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require the Department of Social Services, subject to appropriations, to establish and implement an advertising campaign to recruit adoptive and foster care families. The Department would also set up a 24-hour, toll-free telephone line to assist persons who are interested in becoming adoptive or foster parents.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. This legislation would not affect Total State Revenue.
