**FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business**

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### DESCRIPTION

This proposal authorizes the Superintendent of the State Highway Patrol to prescribe policies providing for increases in the salaries of the members of the Patrol. Each year, prior to the first of January, the superintendent is to submit a salary schedule report to the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and President Pro Tem of the Senate. In addition to other matters deemed pertinent, a comparison of the salaries of police officers of the three largest police departments in the state is to be included in the report. The salary schedule report is to be assigned to the appropriate standing committees to ensure parity in the salary of the members of the Patrol and officers of the three largest police departments is maintained.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
