**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration, Missouri Department of Conservation, Department of Transportation, Department of Insurance** and **Department of Social Services** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** defer to the Department of Transportation for response regarding the fiscal impact of this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state the DOH would absorb the cost for developing the consent form and place the approved form on the internet for providers to access. Printing costs would be minimal and absorbed by the DOH.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposal could have a negative administrative impact on physicians who operate or practice in a small business.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal revises a provision pertaining to informed consent for an abortion.

The proposal requires that a physician must certify that a woman gave her informed consent to an abortion, freely and without coercion, 24 hours prior to the abortion.

The informed consent given by a woman will occur after a physician has informed a woman of the increased risk of breast cancer associated with an abortion.

The proposal repeals Subsection 3 of Section 188.039, RSMo, which allows a physician to inform a woman of any other material facts or opinions which, in the exercise of the physician's judgment, are reasonably necessary to allow a woman to give her informed consent to an abortion.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
