### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development – Division of Professional Registration** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their division because the Board already issues such permits.

**Oversight** notes the Code of State Regulations (4 CSR 110-2.170) establishes fees for general anesthesia and conscious sedation. **Oversight** assumes based on the wording in the proposal and limited research on the topic, “deep sedation” and “general anesthesia” are interchangeable terms. Therefore, **Oversight** assumes this proposal is intended to provide statutory authority for regulatory authority currently being exercised by the Missouri Dental Board. Accordingly, **Oversight** assumes no fiscal impact would result from passage of this proposal.

Officials from the **Secretary of State’s Office (SOS)** assume the rules, regulations and forms issued by the Missouri Dental Board could require as many as 4 pages in the *Code of State Regulations*. For any given rule, roughly half again as many pages are published in the *Missouri Register* as in the *Code* because cost statements, fiscal notes and the like are not repeated in the *Code*. SOS estimates the cost of a page in the *Missouri Register* and the *Code of State Regulations* to be \$23 and \$27, respectively. SOS emphasizes the actual costs could be more or less than the estimated cost of \$246 for FY 2004. SOS states the impact of this proposal in

future years is unknown and depends upon the frequency and length of rules, filed, amended, rescinded or withdrawn.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple proposals pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

## DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires that all dentists who prescribe and administer deep sedation or general anesthesia agents, in the course of providing dental services, to possess a deep sedation or general anesthesia permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board. This proposal also requires that all dentists who prescribe and administer conscious sedation agents in the course of providing dental services to possess a conscious sedation permit issued by the Missouri Dental Board.

The Board is authorized to promulgate rules specifying the criteria by which deep sedation or general anesthesia permits may be issued.

This proposal is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
