FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Design and Construction** and the **Office of the Governor** each state the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** assumes that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri National Guard (MNG)** state the armory in Neosho is in poor condition and not adequate for military usage. By closing this armory and transferring the ownership to the City of Neosho, the State of Missouri will avoid significant cost to repair and renovate the existing armory.

Officials from **Newton County** and the **City of Neosho** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes the state will be disposing of the National Guard Armory in Neosho from its general fixed assets for \$1, which is immaterial for purposes of the fiscal note.
