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Bill Summary: This proposal extends the expiration date concerning the installation of fire sprinklers in certain home dwellings to December 31, 2019 and modifies adoption by a political subdivision of certain residence codes.

**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

**ASSUMPTION**

In response to a previous version of this proposal and to a similar bill from this year (Perfected HB 46), officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Division of Fire Safety** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to a similar bill from this year (HB 46) officials from **Johnson County** assumed the proposal would not have a fiscal impact.

Officials from the cities of **Cape Girardeau, Independence, O'Fallon, and Lee's Summit** as well as the counties of **Cape Girardeau, Barry, and Holt** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

**Oversight** assumes the extension of the sunset date for the fire sprinkler system installation option and the other provisions in the bill will not create a fiscal impact for the state or for local political subdivisions.
