FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Conservation** and **Missouri State Highway Patrol** assumes there is no fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

**Oversight** assumes the proposed legislation would create an increase in the number of deer hunting permits issued by the Department of Conservation, during the muzzleloader portion of firearms deer season.

**Oversight** assumes it is unknown how many new permits would be issued.

The act specifies that the use of handguns shall be an allowable hunting method during the muzzleloader portion of the firearms deer season.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
