FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Buchanan County Sheriff's Department** and the **City of St. Charles Police Department** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

In response to an identical proposal from last year, officials from the **St Louis County Police Department** and the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assumed no fiscal impact for their respective departments.

In response to an identical proposal from last year, officials from the **Springfield Police Department** state this proposal has no fiscal impact. It actually falls in line with current practice. This proposal simply clarifies current regulation.

In response to an identical proposal from last year, officials from the **Jefferson City Police Department (JCPD)** state this proposal does not have a fiscal impact on law enforcement. Statutory violations are not written as a revenue source but as a forced compliance contact. As a department, the JCPD has always followed the change in procedure that this proposal suggests in past contacts anyway.

The proposed legislation appears to have no fiscal impact


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
