FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions, and Professional Registration, Department of Mental Health and Department of Health and Senior Services** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal will have no measurable fiscal impact on the OPS.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. **The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs.** However, it is also recognized that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain within its core budget. **Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.**

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. If there is a significant increase in the number of referrals, the AGO may seek an additional appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - Division of Research and Evaluation** state any violation of the health care provider advertising standards would be dealt with by the respective professional licensing boards. It is not anticipated that passage of this legislation would significantly increase overall health care costs. Therefore, the DSS assumes no fiscal impact.

The proposal will directly impact small business medical providers that choose to advertise their services.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
