FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

SCR 19 - Lead Industry Task Force:

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Office of Governor, Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Natural Resources** and the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Oversight notes upon approval of the Concurrent Resolution task force members would receive reimbursement for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the committee.

Oversight notes the Task Force will terminate by December 31, 2014 or before. Therefore, reimbursement of meeting expenses could occur in the current fiscal year or in the first six months of FY15.

Oversight assumes reimbursement costs of the Task Force would be paid from the Missouri House and Senate Joint Contingent Fund, and these expenses could be absorbed by the fund. This fund receives normal appropriations for various business and legislative committee activity.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
