FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses in violation of child labor laws could be fiscally impacted by this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposal would allow the director of the division of labor standards within the department of labor and industrial relations to consider the size of the business involved when determining the amount of civil damages to request for violating child labor restrictions.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
