FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

The **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assumes the fiscal impact of this proposal would be minimal. Based on information received from the St. Louis College of Pharmacy, there are approximately 1,130 members in the state of Missouri. The DOR assumes 5% of the membership, or 56 people, may apply for the new plates. The number of anticipated applications would be minimal, therefore, the provisions of this proposal could be implemented with existing resources.

Due to the projected minimal number of applications for the St. Louis College of Pharmacy license plates, there will be no measurable revenue increase to the Highway Fund, Cities and County Aid Road Trust Fund (CART.)

The **Department of Transportation** concurs with the Department of Revenue's response to this legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This act allows individuals to get special license plates to help the St. Louis College of Pharmacy. A \$25 emblem use contribution would be made annually to the St. Louis College of Pharmacy by any individual wanting the special plates. All other normal fees would apply, including the fee for personalized plates.
