FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Secretary of State's Office** assume statewide publication of a constitutional amendment costs approximately \$1,455 per column inch based on an estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service x 3 for multiple printings as required by the Constitution and state statute = \$4,380 per column inch. Estimated total number of inches for this amendment would be 10 inches, which would include the title header and certification paragraph. \$4,380 x 10 inches = \$43,800. SOS officials assume this cost would be incurred in FY 2001.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the proposal would result in no fiscal impact to DESE or local public schools.

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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Members of the State Board of Education would be elected, rather than appointed by the Governor. The term of office would be four years, rather than eight years. Vacancies occurring during a member's term would be filled by appointment by the Governor.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
