ASSUMPTION

The **Department of Transportation (DOT)** concurs with the Department of Revenue's response to this proposal.

The **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assumes this proposal requires the Amateur Radio Operator license to contain the words "Amateur Radio" in place of the words "Show-Me State." Accordingly the DOR must reissue all Amateur Radio Operator plates currently issued. Therefore, the Motor Vehicle Bureau will incur expenses of \$7,101 to produce new plates and tabs. The cost of the plates is currently \$5.40 per set. The DOR assumes they will also incur postage and forms costs of \$2,876.
