FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

Until the violation is finally resolved, this bill prohibits the Department of Conservation from issuing a hunting permit or privilege to anyone who failed to appear at a hearing or failed to pay a fine for taking wildlife illegally.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
