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**FISCAL ANALYSIS**

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume that this proposal will not fiscally affect their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** stated that this proposal would not fiscally impact their department. However, the proposal may impact local school districts by an unknown amount. **Oversight** assumes that since this proposal requires a school district to notify a school district where a juvenile is being transferred, this could be done with very minimal costs to the school district. Therefore, Oversight assumes no significant additional costs to the local school districts would result from enactment of this proposal.

Officials from the **St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney** stated that since they already notify schools of the situations outlined in the proposal, enactment of this legislation would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Lafayette County Prosecuting Attorney** stated that they would handle one to two indictments of juveniles per year. Based on this small caseload, the Lafayette County Prosecuting Attorney does not expect to be fiscally impacted by this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

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DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires the county prosecutor to notify the school district when juveniles who are charged as adults are indicted for any actions on the list of reportable acts. The proposal also requires that a superintendent forward written notice when a pupil with a notification of a reportable offense in his or her file transfers to a different school district.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
