FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **House of Representatives** and the **Office of the Governor** stated the proposal would not directly affect their agencies.

Advertisement costs for the proposal would be \$4,380 per newspaper column inch for three printings of the text of the proposal, the introduction, title, fiscal note summary, and affidavit. The proposal would be on the ballot for the November 2000 general election.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal would require the Governor to appear at least once during each calendar month of each regular session the general assembly before the House of Representatives to answer questions relating to executive branch policies and the general state of government.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. The proposal would not affect Total State Revenues.
