FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small business located in certain third class countries that have the assessed valuation necessary to be a county of the first or second class could expect to be fiscally impacted to the extent that they would be regulated, and would have costs of licensing, provided the county commission would appoint a building commission and adopt building code regulations.

DESCRIPTION

This bill allows the county commission in counties with an assessed valuation at or above the level necessary to become a county of the first or second classification which have not yet changed classification to adopt building regulations by ordinance.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
