FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Gaming Commission** and the **Missouri Veterans' Commission** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

According to the Missouri Veterans' Commission, State Veterans Cemetery System, there are five cemeteries planned for eventual construction. The first two sites are in Springfield and Higginsville. Three additional sites are planned for Bloomfield, Jacksonville, and the Jefferson Barracks area of South St. Louis.
