FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

No private provider may establish a private jail with a community unless the provider:

- (1) Furnishes law enforcement, hospitals, and fire districts with formal notification of the intent to establish a private jail;
- (2) Holds public hearings;
- (3) Submits an operational plan to the city or county in which the provider plans to operate;
- (4) Provides the city or county with documentation of its management's qualifications; and
- (5) Provides evidence of the provider's ability to indemnify for liability arising from the operation of the private jail.

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DESCRIPTION (continued)

The proposal adds an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program, and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
