FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **House of Representatives** and the **Senate**, in responses to this and similar proposals, indicated that the proposal would not affect their agencies, administratively.

Advertisement costs for the proposal would be \$4,380 per newspaper column inch for three printings of the text of the proposal, the introduction, title, fiscal note summary, and affidavit. The proposal would be on the ballot for the November 2002 general election.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would change term limits from the current eight years in each chamber. The limit would be twelve consecutive years in any house of the General Assembly. The proposal would also limit persons from serving more than six years as Speaker of the House of Representatives or Presidents Pro Tempore of the Senate.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. The proposal would not affect Total State Revenue.
