FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposal could reduce the availability of future contracts for those businesses contracting with or planning to contract with the Department of Corrections.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation would prohibit the Department of Corrections from entering into contracts with private entities for the operation of any division of the department after January 1, 2002, without specific authority set forth by statute. The proposal would not invalidate current contracts or renewals of current contracts.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
