ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources** stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact to their department.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill allows Greene County and, depending on the 2000 United States census figures, Jefferson County to enact ordinances to reduce conditions on property which constitute a public nuisance. The ordinances may state that if the owner does not remove the nuisance within 7 days of notice, the building commissioner may have the condition eliminated. Cost will be certified to the officer in charge of finance and considered added to the annual real estate tax bill for that property as a personal debt of the owner.

DESCRIPTION (continued)

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
